Courageous Leadership – Building Strong People in a Broken World – Week 10 ANATOMY OF A TRUE REVIVAL Nehemiah 8:1-18

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**Introduction:** So far in our study of Nehemiah, our hero has been laser-focused on creating the <u>structure</u> where spiritual renewal could take place. This structure was important. God's covenant with Israel included his promise of <u>land</u> (Gen. 12:7; 17:7-8), and it included a promise to indwell his <u>city</u>: the city of Jerusalem (Ps. 48:1-3; 68:15-16; 125:2; 132:13-14). Hence, Nehemiah's first order of business was rebuilding the structure of the city since God brought them back into the land. Beginning in chapter 8, we see Nehemiah, along with other leaders like Ezra, take the next step. They move from structure to spirituality. They now work to foster spiritual renewal among the people. We know this is a genuine revival because of their natural passion for God's Word. Israel was rarely passionate about God's Word. Quite the contrary, they were often apathetic and dismissive of God's Word. Not in this chapter! In Nehemiah 8, they are passionate and submitted. As we study this, we will see principles for how genuine renewal takes place in all situations.
